

A message from the Churchwardens and the Chairman of Finance

November 2020

Dear Members of St. Saviour's and St Andrew's congregations.

We recognise that the public health emergency has brought financial hardship to individuals and families across our nation. We know, too, that you will be aware that the financial situation for our church community has also deteriorated substantially since March of this year and that it will get worse as winter comes.

On behalf of our whole church family, and of all those in the wider community to whom our church ministers, thank you to all who have been able to offer regular financial support to God's work here throughout the period since the lockdown began in Spring. This regular giving has enabled the church's ministry to continue both within our church community and across our parish.

If you are a member of our Planned Giving Envelopes scheme, we must apologise to you for not being able to let you have your Planned Giving Envelopes as usual. We know that these have been outstanding for many months but we have not been able to distribute them due to the Pandemic restrictions. We shall be writing to you individually in the coming days asking how you wish to take things forward.

For some of us, COVID restrictions made it impossible for us to give to church regularly, week in and week out, as we would have wished. If you were, or are now, in that situation, and if your own financial position allows it, we hope that you will consider making a donation to church in other ways, such as by cheque or by a direct payment to the Parish bank account (Name St Saviour's PCC Sort

Code 40-10-26 a/c Number 51061844 and ref. Donation), cheques made payable to St Saviour's PCC may be sent to the Parish Office in an envelope marked 'Planned Giving'.

COVID-19 has meant that we have had to consider different methods of asking you to make your donations in the future---to avoid the handling of cash and minimising the amount of cheques coming into the office. From the beginning of January 2021 donations and regular giving may be made by one of the following ways:-

- by Standing Order directly into the Parish Bank account as detailed above.
- by cheque made payable to St. Saviour's PCC and sent to the Parish Office in an envelope marked 'Planned Giving'.
- by contactless bank card or similar, on entering the Church or Parish Centre—this system will be operating by 1st January 2021.
- by envelope deposited in the large plastic box by the Church main door. (Would persons wishing to give by envelope please notify the Parish Office by 30th November 2020 and special arrangements will be made for you to collect your envelopes or have them delivered).
- by cash deposited in the large plastic box by the Church main door.

If anyone has problems concerning any of the above methods do please contact one of us and we will do our utmost to help you.
